Special Meeting

Public hearing for Second Street Residences

- 1) The Meeting was called to order by Mayor, Charles Neff at 7:02 p.m.
 - a) Council Members present were; Charles Neff, Mayor, Bob Dablow, Shelley Poehls, Randy McFarland and Burl Ingebretsen.
 - b) Others present were; Becky Nyland, Clerk, Dan Hanson, Ulteig Engineering, Norm Nyland, Wastewater Superintendent, Mark Hanson, Dave & Jody Suedel, Randy Kraft, Rose Beck, Tammy Alfstad, Bill Brandt, Leishe Woltjer, and Daniel Buttenhoff
- 2) The Pledge of Allegiance was said.
- 3) Council Hears Residences Comments – Charles gave a brief introduction as to what brought us to this meeting. He explained that our low ISO Rating was in jeopardy because of low pressure in Quarterline Crossing. He explained that the City is going to pick up the cost for the water pressure problem and while they we have 2nd Avenue tore up it would be more cost effective to tear up 2nd Street and replace the clay tile sewer lines. He then turned the hearing over to Dan Hanson. Dan handed out a report to everybody and went over each page explaining in detail what needed to be done. There was a lot of discussion on why the “new addition” people don’t have to assessed for the water flow problem. It was stressed that the water portion of the combined project is being paid by the city. There was a suggestion to put a sign up to stop tracks from using 3rd Street to get to Quarterline Crossing. Since this is not directly related the 2nd Avenue and the 2nd Street projects it could not be discussed and will be brought up at the General Meeting. Burl asked what people feelings were. There was more discussion on not wanting to pay the specials, but not being able to pay more for them at a later date.
